

Pastoral Letter for January

Dear People of First Trinity Lutheran Church:

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. Psalm 90:12

The New Year always makes me think about how we name and measure units of time. Some months are named for Roman gods. Fon instance, January is named for Janus, the god of time, beginnings, and transitions. He was imagined to be a god with two faces, as if looking back to the past and forward to the future. Other months were named by their place in the calendar. September, October, November and December were the seventh, eighth, ninth and tenth months, until July and August were added in honor of Julius Caesar and Caesar Augustus.

Genesis tells us that God created the heavens and earth in seven days. But the names of those came to be associated with celestial bodies and Norse gods. Sunday is obvious; Monday is for moon day. Thursday was Thor's day and Friday was Freida's day. Most things in our culture have the number 10 as their base, probably because we have ten fingers. But there are 60 seconds in a minute and 60 minutes in an hour. Perhaps that has something to do with the number 60 being divided evenly by, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 10, 12, 20, and 30.

There are 365 days in a year. Actually, it takes 365.25 days for the earth to revolve around the sun. That's why we have leap years. Every four years we add an extra day to February, as we did in 2024. Some months have 30 days, some have 31, and February has only 28? Why? I don't know. A lunar month, the time it takes to go from a New Moon to a Full moon, is 28 days. It would be nice if all months were 28 days, but 365 is not divided evenly by 28. If all this seems confusing, it is because it is confusing.

As Christians, we know that our times are in God's hands. He sent His Son to be our Savior at just the right time. God put us here at this time to serve His purposes. He has a plan for your life. And that will unfold over time. Whatever this New Year will bring, whatever joys and sorrows there will be, we know that our Lord Jesus will always be with us, leading, guiding and guarding us. And when our time on this earth is through, or when Jesus comes again at the end of time, we will be with Him in eternity. So, this New Year, step out in faith, hope, love, and peace, trusting in God to make 2025 a good, productive, meaningful year.


















The Baptism of Jesus
